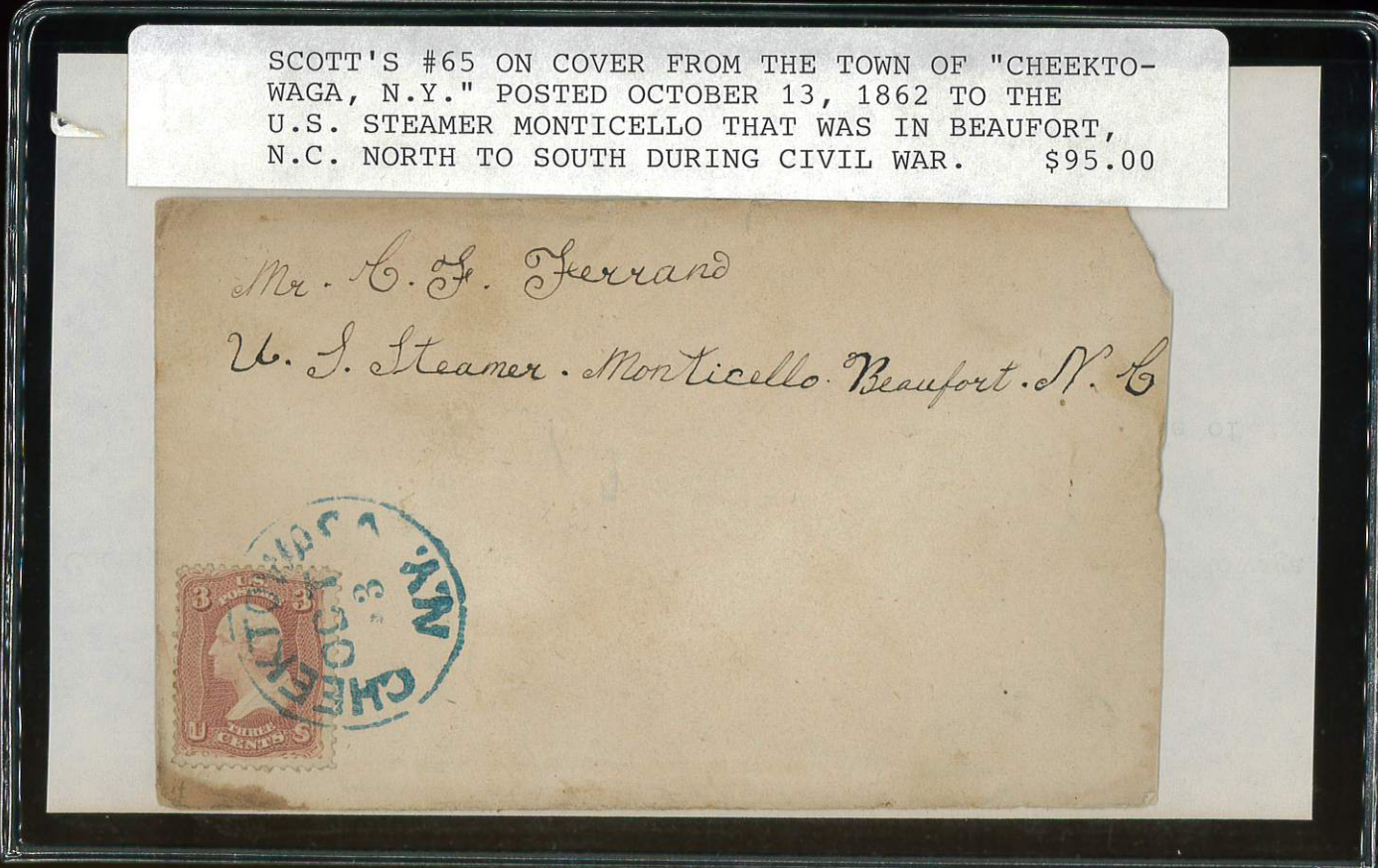

1864 Springfield Illinois cancels on #26 pair stamped cover sent to Fannie Williams at Henry Ill. Odd notation at left "P.M. Please don't stamp Here", I'm not sure why. Interesting Letter enclosed from Sam A. William (or Wilson?): Notes he is at camp, "... I don't think I shall remain here very long but do not know as yet. To any certainty about where I shall go I think of going to Memphis...I guess there is no use of thinking about going West now, though I believe there is more money to be made in the Army, than in California if a fellow is lucky & manages right. I will try speculating this summer... I cam down here today to attend a Government Sale of mules & horses but it does not take place until Monday.... (more interesting but mundane details, later writing on back:) ...Bro Horne told me this eve that the Rebels had surrounded Memphis ..." Cover has slight trim at left, Fine; Letter VF.
