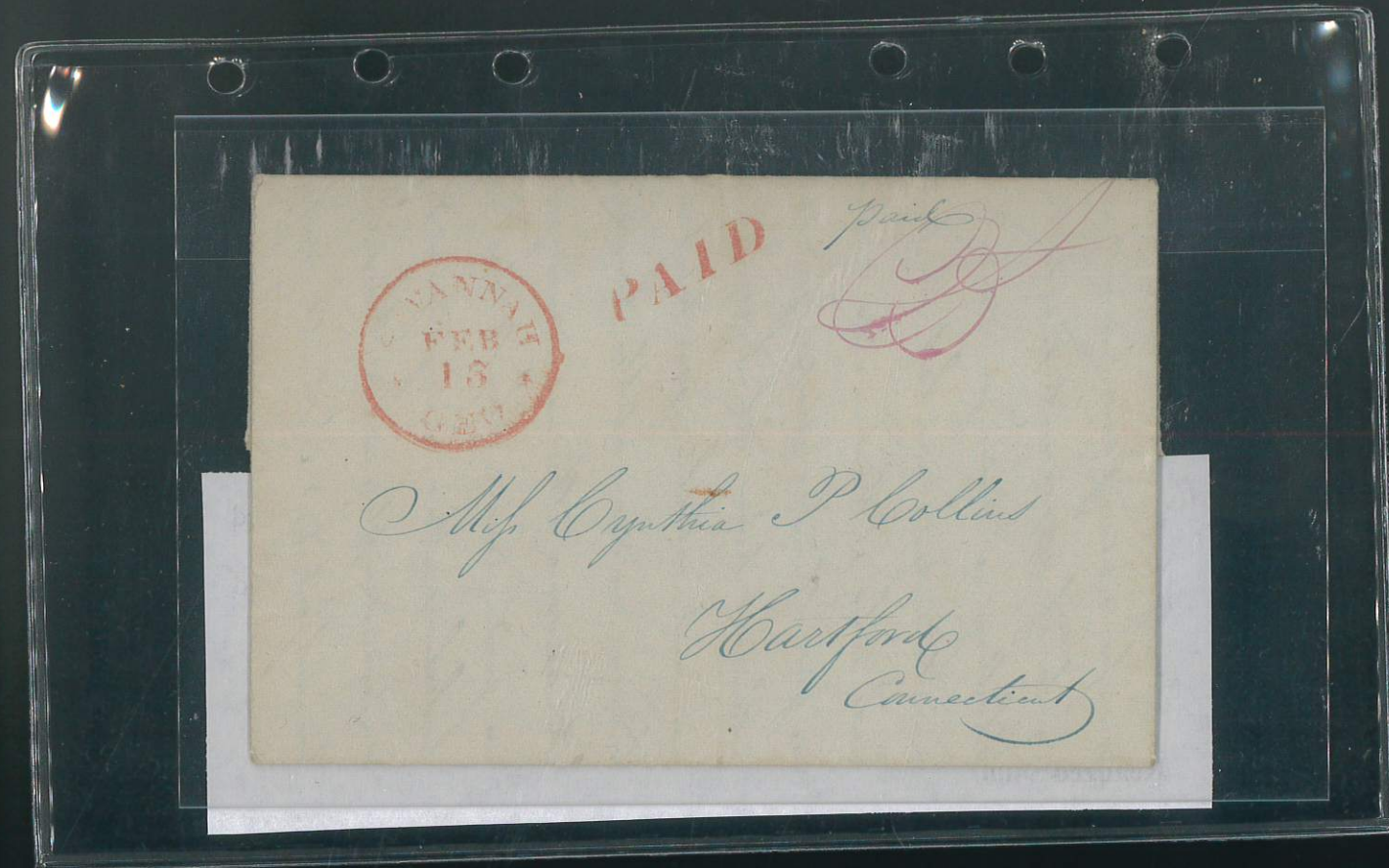
Dateline, Garey's Ferry, Black Creek, E.F. April 23, 1838
Postmarked at Savannah, May 19, 1838, stamped STEAM BOAT.

Regarding purchase of supplies for troops in Florida during Seminole War.

Endorsed, "On public service" and stamped FREE

Post office established here on July 18, 1843.

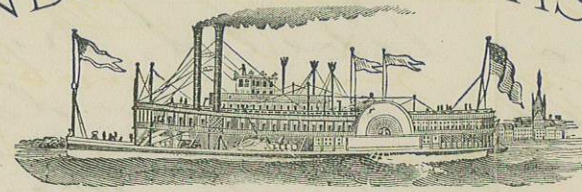

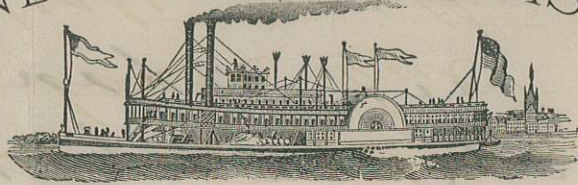

SCARCE REV. WAR DATED (1777) DOCUMENT FROM PENSACOLA, BRITISH WEST FLORIDA. 1pg ms doc., approx. 8.25" x 6", dated Pensacola, February 1st, 1777, being an oath of a British Naval Officer who served with Admiral Hood on the "Vestal" in the reduction of Quebec in the French Indian War. Reads: "Pensacola. Robert Fendall, being duly sworn makes oath and saith that he served as Master's Mate on board of His Majesty's Ship Vestal, commanded by Samuel Hood, at the Reduction of Quebec during the late War, and has never obtained any lands under His Majesty's Proclamation of the 7th of October, 1763..." Signed by Robt. Fendall & sworn before & signed by "Ph. Livingston, Junr., J.P.". 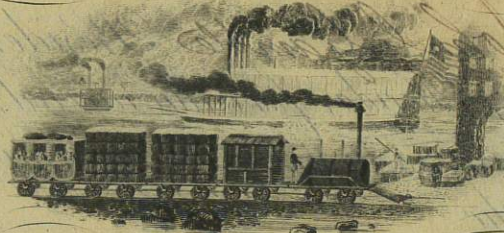
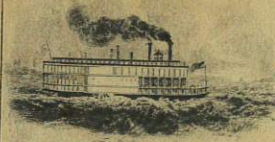

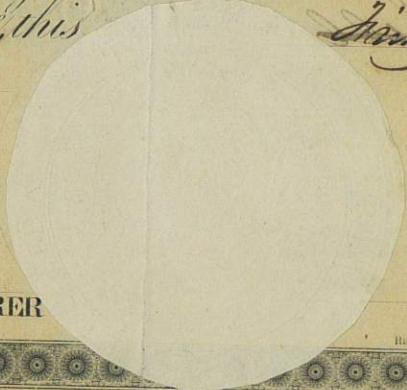

Know all men by these presents, that the Territory of Florida, acknowledge to be indebted to the **UNION BANK** of Florida, in the sum of **ONE THOUSAND** Dollars, which sum the said Territory of Florida, promises to pay in lawful money of the ^{UNITED STATES} to the order of the President, Directors and Company of said Bank, on the First day of June in the year one thousand eight hundred and Sixty Six, with interest at the rate of **SIX** per centum per annum, payable half yearly, at the place named in the endorsement hereon, viz: on the first day of January, and on the first day of July, of every year, until the payment of said principal sum. In testimony whereof, the **GOVERNOR** of the Territory of Florida, hath signed and the **TREASURER** has countersigned these presents, and caused the seal of the Territory to be affixed thereto, at Tallahassee, this Third day of June in the year of our Lord 1838
